

Seneca Recognized by the Santa Barbara Zoo and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service

As an operator in Sepse, Calif., since 1987, Seneca works diligently to support local ecological sustainability. Seneca has taken great effort to ensure that all of our operations take every measure to prevent harm of California's already endangered population of condors. Our practices comply with all California Bureau of Land Management measures, and in some cases, exceed them. The company took additional action after consultation with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, including perimeter fencing around pads where condors have landed; burying and re-orienting electrical lines; adding whirly birds for pumping units to deter landings; grating over well cellars and updated educational seminars for employees and contractors. According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, these rigorous condor protection measures have resulted zero California condor fatalities as a result of Seneca's operations. These extra protections are also part of the reason Seneca Resources was named Operator of the Year by the Bureau of Land Management in 2012.
